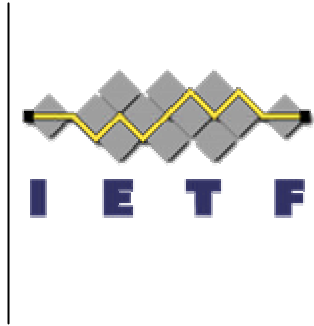
# Who We Were This Time

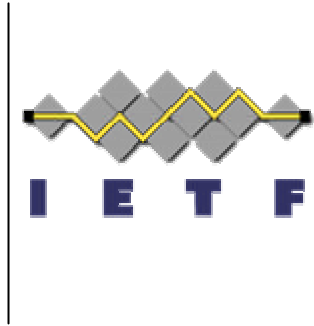
- 1211 attendees

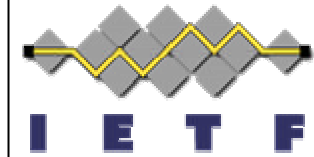




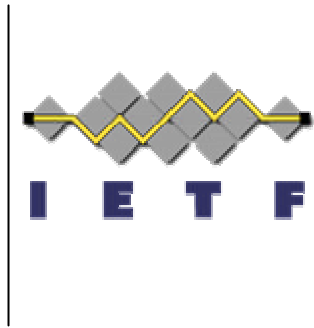
# Future meetings

# What the IESG has done recently



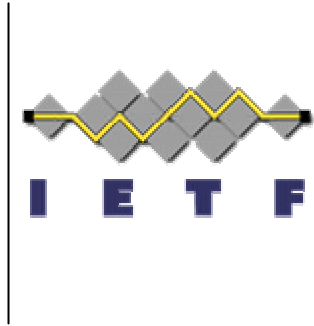
- Approved 36 protocol actions
- Approved 36 document actions
- Created 8 working groups
  - L2vpn, l3vpn, mip4, mip6, xcon, mipshop, imss, ltans
- Closed 7 working groups
  - Malloc, nasreq, ppvpn, ifmib, snmpv3, itrace, rescap
- Moved most groups out of sub-ip (ccamp, mpls)
- Handled 2 appeals
  - Tony Hain: Site-Local determination in IPv6
  - Todd Glassey: barring from WG list
- Improved procedures (online ballot)
- Worked on IETF process issues (hard!)



# Recent RFCs

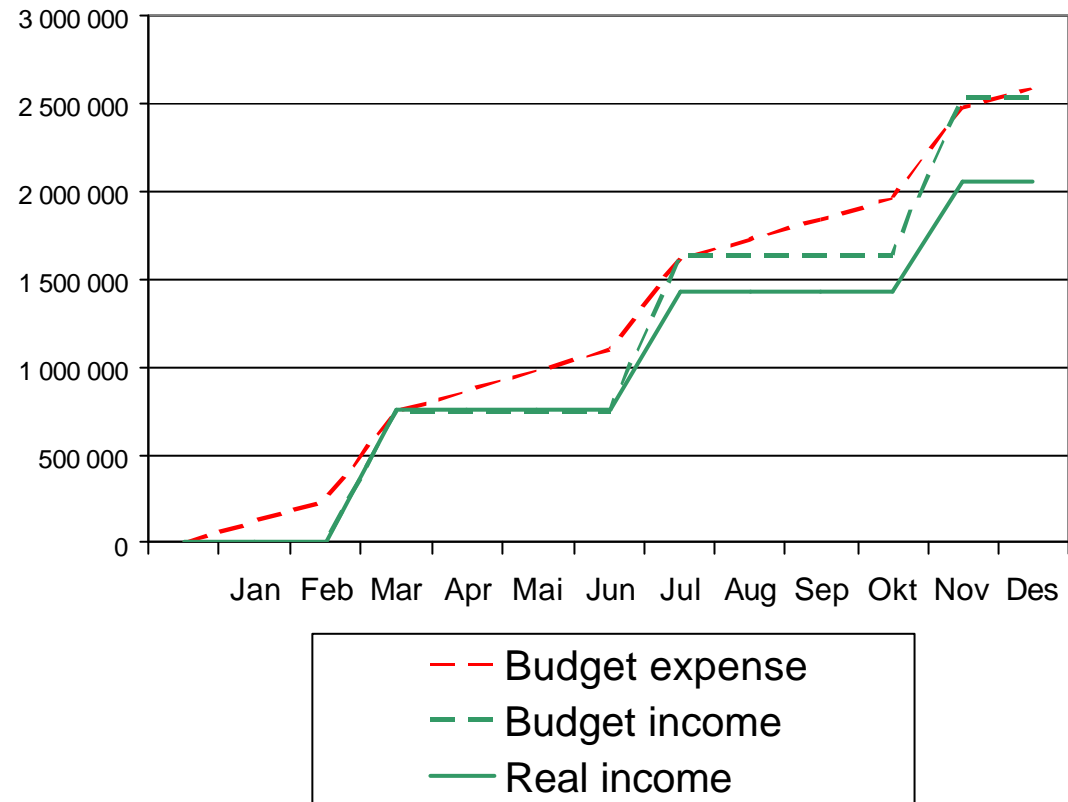
- RFCs in the range from 3550 to 3645

- Maintenance is getting done.



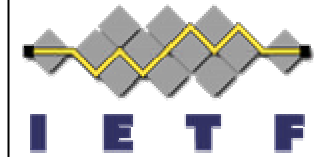


# A brief note on finances
