Updated EDU Team Charter (2)

- * Future Plans (July 2004-July 2005):
 - Making the material covered in our existing training sessions available via the web.
 - Making our web site more available through IETF web site
 - Producing web-accessible educational materials.
 - Submit updates to education-related portions of the IETF web site.



Updated EDU Team Charter (3)

- * Future Plans (continued):
 - Launch two new training topics this year (training sessions and web materials
 - Bringing New Work to the IETF
 - How to bring documents to WGs & form new WGs
 - . Intended to encourage participants to bring new work to the IETF
 - Also covers IPR and control implications of bringing work into the IETF
 - IETF Protocol Engineering Fundamentals
 - Technical topic for all IETF participants
 - Explore technical considerations all authors and reviewers should consider
 - Focus on cross-area issues, such as congestion control and internationalization



Updated EDU Team Charter (4)

- * Future Plans (continued):
 - Work with the Internet Society (ISOC) Standards Publications and Resources committee to develop a proposal for a periodic joint publication that will summarize and explain the major activities of the IETF.
 - This proposal will be publicly presented and submitted for IESG review and approval.
