# STUN/TURN using PHP in Despair (STuPiD)

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## Motivation

- End-to-end streams with TCP-characteristics are required
  - End-to-end secure chatting
  - File Transfer
- InBand Bytestreams (IBB) have limitations
  - Bandwidth limitation
- Home network is behind a NAT
  - Not as simple to penetrate for TCP
  - Symmetric NAT is an open issue
- Relay solutions not widely deployed
  - XMPP: SOCKS5 servers
  - SIP: TURN-TCP

## **Deployment of Relays**

- High bandwidth costs
  - No business model
- Not easy to deploy for a user
  - Requires external server with root access
  - Requires knowledge about Linux/UNIX
  - Requires knowledge about the server software
- External web space with PHP is available
  - Install a PHP script to get a relay
