Goals

- * Give WG Chairs the same authority to manage IETF mailing lists that they have to manage face-to-face meetings
- * Improve the productivity of our mailing lists by allowing a faster and less procedurally complex response to disruptive behaviour
 - ? Any suspension of mailing list posting privileges currently requires IESG approval



Proposal

- * Changes to the last paragraph of RFC 2418, section 3.2
 - ? Give WG chairs the authority to temporarily suspend the posting privileges of disruptive individuals in consulation with AD
 - Relies on WG chair judgment regarding what constitutes disruptive behaviour, how many warnings are required, etc.
 - ? Action is subject to appeal



Open Issues

- Question of whether sequential 30-day suspensions are allowed
 - Intention is that WG chairs can only suspend privileges for 30 days for one incident -- severe incidents that require longer suspension can be referred to the IESG
 - ? Proposed resolution: Adopt new wording that has been proposed and discussed on MPOWR list
- * Question on what happens if AD is unavailable
 - ? New mechanism encourages consultation with the AD, it does not require explicit AD approval
 - ? Proposed Resolution: Clarify wording
- * Various editorial comments



Proposed Next Steps

- * Update document based on mailing list and Gen Area meeting feedback
- * Ask Gen Area AD to sponsor document as an individual submission
- * Send to four week IETF last call
- * Publish as a BCP well before IETF 60
