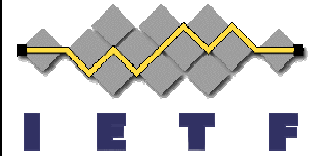


Who We Were This Time

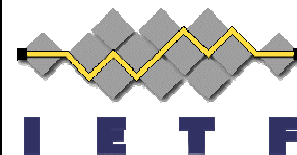
- 1167 registered attendees

Document Actions and RFCs since San Diego



- 4 new WGs, 11 closed WGs
- 448 new I-Ds (268 in last 4 weeks)
- 845 updates (559 in last 4 weeks)
- 74 Last Calls
- 106 approvals (some for multiple docs)
- Around 55 RFCs published (3934-4038)

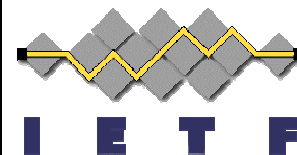

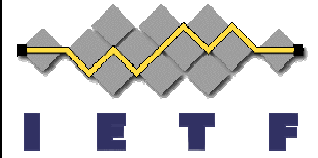

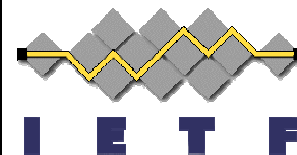


A new service: Audiocast
